INTRODUCTION

The Limerick Lifelong Learning Festival takes place this year from Monday 28th September to Sunday 4th October and marks its 10th anniversary this year. The theme for 2020 is **'Celebrating and Building Learning Communities'** building on the on the tagline for the week-long festival '*Communities, Connecting, Learning*'; and for the first time is being run as a virtual festival this year. It will also celebrate Limerick as a UNESCO Learning City-Region.

The excitement of learning will be promoted through a multitude of varied events including: online interactive information sessions; live presentations /broadcasts via zoom/YouTube channel/Facebook streaming, short films, pre-recorded events/activities, webinar panel debates/discussions, information sessions and live chats. 



The Irish Network of Learning Cities was formed in late 2018 and had its first meeting as part of Cork's Learning Cities Conversations event. The network includes Limerick, Cork, Belfast, Dublin and Derry-Strabane Learning City-Regions. All member cities have adopted the UNESCO Guidelines for Building Learning Cities and are members of the UNESCO Global Network of Learning Cities (GNLC).

The network members share learning and best practice and offer support to each other on issues of common interest to their learning cities. Network members also attend and present at each other's events hosted by each of the member learning cities; such as the 'Bridging the Gap' seminar held as part of the Limerick Lifelong Learning Festival in April 2019. On Wednesday 2nd September 2020, the Network held a collaborative webinar; hosted by the Festival Coordinators in all five Irish cities. This event was part of the Global Learning Festival 1st – 4th September; which was organised by Wyndham and Melton Learning Cities in Australia, in collaboration with PASCAL. This event gave a flavour of the five Irish Learning Cities and their Festivals.

Also during the Limerick Festival week this year, the Irish Network is hosting a collaborative Irish Learning Cities Day on Wednesday 30th September 2020. There will be online events hosted by Learning Limerick, Cork, Belfast, Dublin and Derry Strabane Learning Cities in partnership with each other. The five cities will also share some stories of learners who have been involved in their festivals; and collectively promote these powerful messages of lifelong learning.

Learning Ambassadors Project

The Learning Ambassadors project commenced in 2019. The Ambassadors are Limerick people from all walks of life, united by a common interest in promoting, developing and celebrating learning, in all its forms, throughout Limerick City and County. They are welcoming, friendly and proud that Limerick is a Learning Region. They are willing to share their experiences of formal and informal learning and happy to help others find opportunities for learning. The Ambassadors can spread the word and promote the idea of lifelong learning in their own communities, workplaces and neighbourhoods. They can help break down all sorts of barriers to learning as they share inspiring learning stories from their own lives or the lives of people in their families and communities. The Learning Ambassadors are important as they can help put a friendly face on organisations involved with learning.

There is enthusiasm amongst the Learning Ambassadors sub-group that this project presents an opportunity not to hold onto what you have learned. It can be rewarding to know you can enhance someone's self-confidence in learning. There may be an opportunity to work more on advocacy and outreach as part of this initiative. The group has also discussed barriers to accessing learning; for example the issues of transport and costs of transport for rural communities.

In November/December 2019, the Learning Ambassadors participated in a Story Exchange training project with Narrative 4, which developed their skills to 'tell their story'. The Narrative 4 training model develops empathy through sharing your story with your partner and retelling your partner's story back to the group; in their . Following this training, the Ambassadors told their own stories of lifelong learning on video interviews. The ambassadors were interviewed on their stories and why they are passionate about becoming a Learning Ambassador. This series of interviews will be launched in collaboration with the Lifelong Learning Festival 2020.

BRIEF HISTORY OF Limerick Lifelong Learning Festival and Learning Limerick

The original Limerick City of Learning Steering Group was established as a sub-committee of the Limerick City Development Board in 2002. A key goal of the Board's Strategy for the City was that Limerick would become a City of Learning – a city full of opportunities. The City of Learning Steering Group's produced its first strategy document in 2008: 'Together for a Brighter Future – *Collaborative Framework for Progress*'. The group held its first Limerick Lifelong Learning Festival in 2011. The expansion of its membership in 2013 to include both City and County partners resulted in the name of the group being rebranded to: 'Learning Limerick'. The Learning Limerick group is working under its current Strategic Plan – *Helping to Grow Limerick as a Learning Region (2018 – 2022)*. Learning Limerick also launched its new website www.LearningLimerick.ie in 2019. This website promotes Limerick as a Learning Festival continues to be hosted on www.limerick.ie/lovelearning.

The annual festival promotes learning in all its forms and in all aspects of life. The festival includes performances, taster sessions, tours, displays, lectures, walks, demonstrations and workshops. Since the first festival in 2011, the event has gone from strength to strength and it is now **celebrating 10 years with its first virtual festival**. It has proven to be an extremely effective mechanism for bringing together both formal and informal learning activities and connect with learners throughout Limerick.

UNESCO Global Network of Learning Cities

Limerick has been a member of the UNESCO Global Network of Learning Cities (GNLC) since 2016. In 2017, Limerick was selected, along with 15 other cities that year, by an international jury for the outstanding progress made in promoting education and lifelong learning for all in their local communities; and to receive the UNESCO Learning City Award.

In October of 2019, representatives of Learning Limerick were invited to attend the Fourth International UNESCO Learning Cities Conference in Medellin. The UNESCO Global Network of Learning Cities has 170 active members from 53 countries in every region of the world.



The conference theme was 'Inclusion – A principle for lifelong learning and sustainable cities'. Councillor Sarah Kiely, deputising for the Mayor of Limerick City and County, was invited to speak on the theme "Digitally Excluded Citizens". Councillor Sarah Kiely presented on the work of the Digital Inclusion working group, a sub-group of the Smart Limerick initiative.

Since the UNESCO Conference in 2019, Limerick is a member of the Clusters on Entrepreneurship and Educational Planning, Monitoring and Evaluation for Learning Cities and we are looking forward to sharing learning with the other member cities in these key strategic clusters.

On 6th May 2020, UNESCO hosted a global webinar on open distance learning as part of its ongoing series for members of the UNESCO GNLC. The Chairperson of Learning Limerick, Eimear Brophy was invited to present on the Limerick experience on open and distance learning to the large global audience that attended the webinar.
