INTRODUCTION

The Limerick Lifelong Learning Festival takes place across Limerick City and County from Monday 8th to Sunday 14th April and marks its 9th anniversary this year. The theme for 2019 is 'Bridging the Gap' in learning (between young and old, rural and urban, returning to learning and welcoming new communities). This theme builds on the tagline for the week-long festival 'Communities, Connecting, Learning'. The excitement of learning will be promoted through a multitude of varied events including: performances, tours, displays, lectures, walks, demonstrations and workshops. With 200 free events in this year's programme, there is certainly something for everyone to choose from; with a diversity of activities that includes dance, art, health and science, business and developing career options.

Limerick is a member of the UNESCO Global Network of Learning Cities (GNLC), and was honoured to receive the UNESCO Learning City Award in 2017. This international recognition for Limerick is a testament to the collaborative work of the partners in Limerick, which includes the success of the Limerick Lifelong Learning Festival. The flagship event for the festival this year will be the National Learning Cities Seminar which will be held in King John's Castle in Limerick on Wednesday 10th April. The seminar will include visiting speakers from partner learning cities from the All-Island of Ireland Network of Learning Cities/ Regions – Cork, Belfast, Dublin and Derry-Strabane. This will provide the opportunity to share learning city-region updates and good practice. This seminar will offer an excellent opportunity for Limerick to continue its work as part of the UNESCO Global Network of Learning Cities.

The Learning Limerick Steering Group presents the festival each year. This group represents all the main stakeholders involved in promoting learning in Limerick. This year's festival will see the addition of Learning Ambassadors, who will visit festival events. The role of the Learning Ambassador is to narrate their personal learning journey and to inspire others to participate in learning, through promoting the idea of lifelong learning in their own communities, workplaces and neighbourhoods. Mayor James Collins launched this initiative in Council Chamber on March 7th.

On behalf of the steering group, I would like to especially thank all those involved in planning the festival and running the numerous events. Without the continued hard work and commitment of all the various event organisers, the variety of events planned for the 9th Limerick Lifelong Learning Festival would not be possible. I would also like to express my thanks to our sponsors who provide vital funding to run the festival. I look forward to seeing you during the week.
