

INTRODUCTION

The Limerick Lifelong Learning Festival takes place this year from Monday 24th September to Sunday 30th May and is now in its 11th year. The theme for 2021 is 'New Futures, New Adventures in Learning' and is being run for the second time as a virtual festival. The festival provides a timely opportunity to reflect on the many innovative ways we have been continuing to engage in learning over the last year; while also exploring how learning will continue to bring us on new adventures in the future. The festival also celebrates Limerick as a UNESCO Learning City-Region. The Learning Limerick Steering Group is a proud member and award winner of the UNESCO Global Network of Learning Cities (GNLC). Indeed, the UNESCO GNLC supports and improves the practice of lifelong learning in the world's cities.

The excitement of learning will be promoted through a multitude of varied events during the festival week including: online interactive information sessions; live presentations / broadcasts via zoom/YouTube channel/ Facebook streaming, short films, pre-recorded events/activities, webinar panel debates/ discussions, information sessions and live chats. With over 100 free events in this year's programme, there is certainly something for everyone to choose from; with a diversity of activities that includes dance, art, health and science, business and developing career options.

The flagship event for the festival this year is 'Meet our Learning Ambassadors' panel discussion event on the first day of the festival. In this webinar, we are building on the great work of the Ambassadors in promoting lifelong learning; following the launch of their videos series last December. This Learning Ambassadors video interview series is promoted via our Learning Limerick Website and Social Media platforms. One of our own

Ambassadors will be interviewing the other Ambassadors on their learning adventures and future plans for both their



careers and continued learning. The interactive interviews will then be followed by a panel discussion to include some of our Learning City partners.

We are also delighted to be hosting an international webinar in the lead up to the festival this year. On the 13th May, Limerick and Wyndham (Australia) Learning Cities are co-hosting a Webinar on 'Transformation through Empathy Partnerships' with PASCAL that will explore dynamic partnership models from around the world, including the island of Ireland. PASCAL Learning Cities Networks (LCN) are an international interactive policy-oriented groups of stakeholders within cities; sharing ideas and experience directed at innovative responses to the big issues confronting cities; including the promotion of sustainable learning city development.

The Learning Limerick Steering Group presents the festival each year. This group represents all the main stakeholders involved in promoting learning in Limerick. The Festival represents an opportunity to engage directly with the public and to be part of an event which showcases Limerick. On behalf of the steering group, I would like to express my thanks to our sponsors who provide vital funding to run the festival. 
Irish Network of Learning of Learning Cities



The Irish Network of Learning Cities includes Limerick, Cork, Belfast, Derry and Dublin Learning Cities. All five learning cities collaborated in holding the Network's first 'Irish Learning Cities Day' on 30th September 2020, which was held during Limerick Lifelong Learning Festival week. Festival Coordinators from Limerick, Cork, Belfast, Derry and Dublin also hosted a joint webinar on our Learning Festivals as part of the first 'Global Festival of Learning' in September 2020. Learning Limerick also contributed to a Case Study for Adult Learning and Health and Well-Being as part of research that was conducted by the Northern Ireland Impact Forum for Adult Learning, in partnership with Belfast Learning City; for their 'Learn Well, Live Well' Report. The Limerick Case Study focused on the Limerick Learning Neighbourhoods initiative and Learning Limerick gave a presentation input at the Belfast Webinar in December 2020.

This year, Learning Limerick also participated at the webinar series for Cork Learning City launching their 'Cork Celebrates Lifelong Learning' Awards in March 2021. Limerick shared our local initiatives of the Learning Ambassadors project, and the Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board's 'Coding Careers for Women' initiative. We look forward to many more collaborations in the coming year.

Limerick is also a member of the UNESCO Cluster on Entrepreneurship & Entrepreneurial Learning.
