Representing 15 organisations and 3000 adults across the city, the LCEN works tirelessly in supporting and promoting community adult education, all the while staying true to their ethos of 'education for the community within the community.' Taking place outside of the formal education sector, community education aims to 'enhance learning, foster empowerment, and contribute to civic society.' The strategic plan was developed following a comprehensive consultation process with members; facilitated by PAUL Partnership.

The event featured a number of guest speakers including Mayor of Limerick City and County Council, Councillor Daniel Butler and Triona Lynch, Further Education and Training Manager at the Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board, with both highlighting the vital role the LCEN undertakes in community education. Learner Karen Wallace shared her experiences about her own learning journey and her work as Chair of the Moyross Adult Education Group, with presentations being made to Helen Flanagan and Josephine Sheedy in acknowledgment of their years of hard work and dedication to the LCEN.
