The sixth International UNESCO Learning Cities Conference was held in Jubail, Saudi Arabia from 3rd – 5th December; a conference that we followed online. In preparation for this conference, UNESCO facilitated an online webinar meeting for the European and North American Network of Learning Cities on October 9th 2024. Yvonne Lane, Learning Limerick Coordinator, presented on the work and achievements of the Irish Network of Learning Cities at this webinar.

A group from Learning Limerick met with Katja Roemer from the UNESCO Institute of Lifelong Learning in Cork last year. This was part of a shared island event hosted by Cork Learning City; and our Limerick Mental Health Association representative lan Hackett presented on their 'Buddy Bench' project at this international seminar.

We look forward to continuing our collaborations and active membership of the UNESCO Global Network of Learning Cities.
